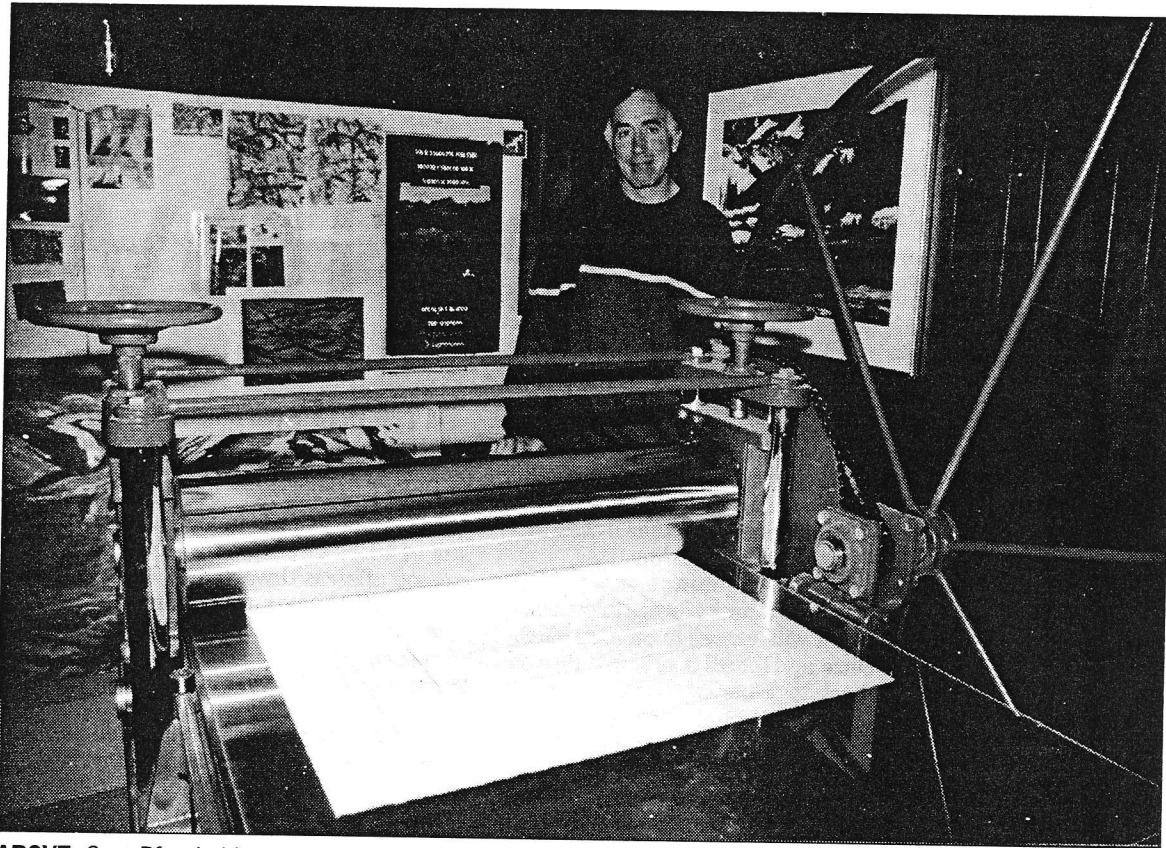

Printmaker featured at Pegasus

CORVALLIS — Printmaker Greg Pfarr will be featured during the month of January at the Pegasus Frame Studio and Gallery, 341 S.W. Second St.

The exhibit will feature some education material about the printmaking process as they relate to the artist's own imagery explorations.

A reception for the artist will be held from 6:30 to 9 p.m. Friday, Jan. 8.

This event is free and open to the public.

Pfarr received a master of fine arts degree from Ohio State University in 1975, and moved to Corvallis in 1980. His appreciation of the rugged Northwest wilderness is reflected in these print images represented. The display will include images of the Cascade Mountains, John Day River Valley, the High Desert and Hell's Canyon.

The intaglio process to make prints require control and Pfarr is always alert to the possibilities of experimentation. His exhibit contains numerous



examples of his willingness to track an image along inventive pathways, including a new continuous tone lift ground process.

Pfarr is a nationally recognized printmaker and is a member of the Boston Printmakers, the Los Angeles Printmaking Society, The Print

Club of Philadelphia, The Northwest Print Council and the Artist in the Sky of Corvallis.
